

Falling Deeply in Love with Yeshua



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You know the greatest command is to love God with all your being. But now, have you fallen in love with Yeshua (Jesus)? Have you thought of such intimacy with your Redeemer? Can you imagine not being in love with Someone you hope to marry? HOW does one fall in love with our Savior? Do you express your love, in clear terms? I hope you find this to be a deeper element of coming to know your God and Savior.

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Hello, everyone and welcome again to Light on the Rock.

On the audio of this sermon – I recount the story of falling in love with a girl who would some years later be my wife. There was the first flush of being interested in this young lady, then how I couldn't get her out of my mind, then wanting to be with her constantly and to listen to her and to talk to her as I did as much as possible with her. I wanted to get to know her, and realized I had fallen in love with Carole, my wife to be.

We know our God says the greatest commandment of all is to love your God with all your heart, with all your mind, all your soul and all your being – everything you've got, you love him.

Now you know that, but *have you fallen in love with Yeshua*, the son of God, the King of kings whom you hope to marry someday?

In my last sermon, I talked about our greatest quest: to come to know our God and our Saviour. Today, let's kick it up a notch. I mentioned last time how "coming to know" someone Biblically was very, very intimate. So in this message, I want to focus specifically on this concept -- about ***falling in love with your Messiah***.

Paul said his greatest quest in life was to come to fully know Yeshua, the Messiah (Philippians 3:9) we covered that last time. And we covered how

Biblically the term “to know your wife” was in the context of the deepest of intimacies.

Is your love for the Messiah...intimate, close and loving? Let me ask it another way: **Are you falling deeper and deeper in love with Yeshua** -- your Messiah- your Husband, Lord, King and Master?

Have you ever even heard that *expression* – “falling in love with Yeshua?” Probably not, right? Or if you have, do you talk about your quest to more deeply fall in love with your Redeemer?

After all, many of those being called now are being prepped to be the *Bride* of the Son of God. We’re going to marry the King of kings. I can’t imagine marrying someone whom you haven’t fallen in love with. It would be a nightmare. So are you learning this concept, and experiencing this concept, of actually FALLING IN LOVE with Yeshua, our Lord, King, Master and fiancé?

(Opening prayer – on the audio)

The early believers were filled with JOY, excitement, and LOVE for Messiah – and awe, and wonder. They were thrilled, and willing to die for Him. There was electricity in the air about them and their passion for Christ.

How do WE stack up to that today?

SO many focus on technical data of scripture but rarely speak of the JOY of his salvation, or of the delight you feel that you have been called to marry the Son of God – and have a very deep personal relationship that is evident in our lives and something we feel and know we have. A couple out west I know – Mike and Sandy – have been so good at focusing on this topic.

We all know by now that the greatest of all commands is to love God with all our being (Mark 12:29-31). “God” – Elohim, Yehovah – I’ve shown before, includes God the Father and Yeshua, who is also clearly “God”, as **John 1:1-3** so clearly states. The Word -- Jesus Christ, or Yeshua the Messiah -- was God, and IS God, just as God the Father is God. They are so united that they are depicted and seen as “One”.

Many people use the verse about “if you love me, keep my commandments” – and since they feel they keep God’s commandments, they must therefore love him. That surely is the *foundation* of the relationship -- obedience and adoration – but from there we build a genuine desire for our Maker and feel a deep, longing love for him. This sermon is focusing on that part of it: adding the dimension of the heart, the passion, the aspect of falling in love with him.

If you find this concept too intimate, I suggest

- Read the Song of Songs again – which is about our Redeemer and the elect Bride
- We have been espoused to Christ as his chaste virgin (2 Cor. 11:2), ready to marry him or at least be at the wedding supper.
- Can you imagine marrying someone you don't feel passionately in love with? Of course not. And you would express that love over and over before and after that marriage.

Make no mistake about it: God wants to be loved! Yeshua asked Peter 3x after the Resurrection – “Peter, do you LOVE me?” (**John 21:15-17**). And three times Peter replies – “Yes, Lord, I love you!” Have you ever actually said “I love you” to the Son of God, your Messiah, Yeshua of Nazareth?

HONESTLY: can you say you know you have that deep, deep knowing of Yeshua that you can say, and have said many times, “Lord, I love you”? *So many confess to a feeling that something is missing. They wonder if they even HAVE a relationship with Yeshua. There's emptiness instead. So many confess they don't know if their prayers really “go up to Him” or not. And yet we're supposed to be falling ever deeper in love with him. So I hope and pray this topic will bless you.*

So with that ... let's talk about falling in love with our Saviour (yes, sometimes, for our British and Canadian audience, I'll spell some words the way they do. I love all those who come to this site).

TRUE CHRISTIANITY IS A HEART RELATIONSHIP

The Bible is so clear; God wants our HEART in this. Do you feel your heart is with Yeshua, and that you have Him in your heart? Some fear that concept, feeling its “syrupy” or not their style. But having a heart for God is all through the Bible.

Romans 10:8-10 is so clear that we must believe and feel it in our hearts – and then profess him with our mouths. Go back and read it.

The Ethiopian eunuch, whom Philip baptized, was given a pre-condition to baptism **Acts 8:36-37**. Philip said, “if you believe with all your HEART, then you may be baptized.”

Last time I mentioned the verse, “These people honor me with their lips, but their HEART is far from me” **Matthew 15:8-9**

“My Son, give me your heart....” **Prov 23:26**

To the Ephesians ... “You’ve lost your first love...” **Rev 2:4**

There are literally hundreds of times the heart is invoked in scripture!
IN fact, Yeshua and God our Father want to come dwell in our hearts by the Holy Spirit.

Ephesians 3:17-19

*“that **Christ may dwell in your hearts** through faith; that you, being rooted and grounded **in love**, 18 may be able to comprehend with all the saints what is the width and length and depth and height — 19 to **know the love of Christ which passes knowledge**; that you may be filled with all the fullness of God”.*

2 Peter 1:19

And so we have the prophetic word confirmed, which you do well to heed as a light that shines in a dark place, *until the day dawns and the Morning Star [that’s Yeshua, folks] rises in your hearts...*”

Of course we cannot be living a life of sin and disregard for what our Husband-to-Be stands for and expect this heartfelt love to be there. Here are our King’s own words, straight from his heart to ours:

John 14:19-22

19 "A little while longer and the world will see Me no more, but you will see Me. Because I live, you will live also. 20 At that day you will know that I am in My Father, and you in Me, and I in you. **21 He who has My commandments and keeps them, it is he who loves Me. And he who loves Me will be loved by My Father, and I will love him and manifest Myself to him.**"

Don’t just read over that quickly. When we live as He lives, He loves us, and will manifest himself to us. Other translations say “I will *reveal* myself to him/her”, or “*show* myself”.... We’ll know we are coming to know him, see him, and hear him – the more He is revealed to us.

Let’s continue in **John 14:23-24**

“Jesus answered and said to him, **“If anyone loves Me, he will keep My word; and My Father will love him, and We will come to him and make Our home with him.** 24 He who does not love Me does not keep My words; and the word which you hear is not Mine but the Father’s who sent Me.”

This is what we should be experiencing: the indwelling of God the Father himself and Yeshua, thru the spirit; a solid love connection going on.

This has been the theme of many of my sermons. Data, doctrine and information are all needed and fine. We're to grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord; I know that. But it goes beyond that. Prophecy is fine. Truth is needed – for Father wants to be worshiped in spirit and truth. I get that. I preach truth. But I also preach how God wants your heart.

Brothers and sisters in Christ, are you hearing this? We must be falling in love with our maker who formed humanity out of the dust of the earth.

We must love God. Some clear verses that assume God's people LOVE him...

James 1:12-- the crown of life is promised to those who love him.

James 2:5

*"...the kingdom which He promised to those **who love Him?**"*

1 Corinthians 2:9

9 But as it is written:

"Eye has not seen, nor ear heard,

Nor have entered into the heart of man

The things which God has prepared for those **who love Him.**"

And we're told that if we love God the Father, we have to also love the One he sent – His son (**1 John 5:1-3**).

Do we not remember the three times when Yeshua asks Peter, in front of the other apostles after the Resurrection – “But Peter, do you LOVE (agape) me?” (**John 21:15-17**). And three times Peter assured him of his brotherly love.

God wants to be loved. And he wants to love you- and does! Many believers will confess that God so *loved the world* ... but have difficulty believing God could love you, because of all their shortcomings. But in fact, he loves you and everyone so much, that he made a way of escape out of the hell-hole we all got ourselves into – by offering his Son to take on himself all the anger, condemnation, guilt, separation and penalty that WE deserved.

God made humans so there could be an intimate relationship unlike anything we've ever known. Ever. This happens once we are reconciled with him.

So HOW Does One “Fall in love” with the Son of God?

Now the hard part. HOW does one “fall in love”.

I’m pondered this long and hard. Is there really any formula we can give to show you how to fall in love with someone? Or, other than first-glance puppy love – or even lust – don’t we fall in love with someone we start to interact with because he/she is so so warm, so caring, so loving to US, so concerned, so interested in us... and something begins to happen inside us?

Around this person you’re falling in love with, you have no fear. You realize they love YOU – not the outfits you wear, not because you’re perfect, not because you’re always gorgeous... no, that person loves YOU – disheveled hair or not, whether you’re always a delight or not.

So HOW do we fall in love with God and/or the Son of God?

POINT 1: Here’s what God says: it starts with HIM.

1 John 4:19

“We love ***because*** he first loved us.”

Even as a child I remember having a hunger to walk and talk with God, or Jesus, and I often did, on the beaches of the Philippines. It felt like my hunger for him, but it was the other way around. Please, we must acknowledge this. Sometimes we feel like we are searching for him, like we are desire him, like we want the relationship – but really it’s just us answering the impulse HE put inside us first.

You surely remember **John 6:44**, that the process starts with God Most High, the King of the Universe, who is greater even than Yeshua – personally choosing you to be among his firstfruits. In many cases, as I showed last time, that begins before some were even BORN.

You know how Paul persecuted the ekklesia – the body of believers, to the death even. But he says in **Gal 2:20** – that he, Paul, no longer lives, but Christ lives in him..., and he goes on: “and the life I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the son of God who loved me and gave himself for ME.”

Was Paul seeking Christ? Yes and no. He was seeking the body of Christ – to persecute and even kill some. Christ sought HIM.

And THEN, when we’re given the invitation to be a part of the Marriage Supper of the king’s son, THEN we respond, with all our heart and with humble JOY... then we respond! Matthew 20.

John 15:16

“You did not choose Me, but I chose you and appointed you that you should go and bear fruit, and that your fruit should remain, that whatever you ask the Father in My name He may give you.”

Now a HUGE, HUGE point about falling in love with Messiah.

PT 2 To love God, we have to grasp and accept how much we've been forgiven by God, demonstrating his tremendous love for us.

Make no mistake about it: you and I and everyone - have all sinned to the point of earning our own death penalty from God. The wages of sin is death (**Romans 6:23**), not eternal life in hell as some teach. God's GIFT is eternal life through Christ. Do you see how much you've been forgiven? Have you accepted Christ's offer to take from the penalty, guilt, condemnation, separation from God and everything else your sins have caused?

Let me further explain. Would you say Paul loved Yeshua? No question about it. WHY do you think he did?

I believe once Paul came to the realization that he was such a *mean, mean person*- before he was changed by God's love and Spirit. When Paul realized how *vile* he had been, how *cruel* he had been to men and women of faith, that he must have broken down in a fountain, a waterfall, of tears of repentance. It was only when Paul could realize, “Christ came into the world to save sinners, of whom I am ...CHIEF.” (1 Timothy 1:1) “I'm CHIEF SINNER”, Paul said. I don't think he was trying to be modest. He meant it. And he WAS!

When we come to realize how much we've been forgiven, and what God and the Son of God had to go through TO forgive us, we will love Christ so deeply.

Sometimes people say they feel a deep love in my sermons for Christ. If you do, my dear brothers and sisters, it's because I've had to come to admit what awful, awful sins I've committed, how many lives I've destroyed, how mean I've been, how much pain I've caused so many.... And yes, I have.

It's only in realizing what the 2nd most Powerful Being in the Universe did for me, for ME personally, that I could begin to love him back more than before. We have to personalize it, like Paul does.

So in **Galatians 2:20** – Paul speaks of how, in his words, “Christ who LOVED ME, and gave himself for ME...”

JOB was restored to God and blessed, when he came to see – at the end of Job, in spite of how good a person he was, one of the 3 most righteous to ever live, and yet he still need a Savior! It was only when Job could say out loud, “I abhor myself and repent in dust and ashes” (**JOB 42:4-6**) that he could also say, “NOW I GET IT. I’d heard about you, but now I see you. And now that I see YOU, I abhor myself, and repent in dust and ashes.” **Job 42:4-6**

God restores Job.

This point, in how to come to deeply love Yeshua, also goes back to the story of the sinful woman who was washing our Saviour’s feet with tears flowing from her eyes, which came from remorse for her sins, and affection she felt for him, -- all while the others around him were wondering how he could stand to have such a sinful woman around him, touching him.

Let’s look at the story, for in here is this HUGE point that will help us all fall in love more with our Messiah.

Luke 7:36-50, and I’ll summarize the story here, but be sure to STUDY this several times when you get a chance.

Yeshua had been invited to a Pharisee’s home. While they’re reclining at dinner, a woman of ill repute (perhaps sexual ill repute), came to Yeshua’s reclined body and starts touching him, washing his feet in her tears and anointing his feet with fragrant oil. Let’s pick it up:

Luke 7:36-48

Then one of the Pharisees asked Him to eat with him. And He went to the Pharisee's house, and sat down to eat. 37 And behold, *a woman in the city who was a sinner*, when she knew that Jesus sat at the table in the Pharisee's house, brought an alabaster flask of fragrant oil, 38 and stood at His feet behind Him weeping; and she began to wash His feet with her tears, and wiped them with the hair of her head; and she kissed His feet and anointed them with the fragrant oil. 39 Now when the Pharisee who had invited Him saw this, he spoke to himself, saying, "This Man, if He were a prophet, would know who and what manner of woman this is who is touching Him, for she is a sinner."

40 And Jesus answered and said to him, "Simon, I have something to say to you."

So he said, "Teacher, say it."

41 "There was a certain creditor who had two debtors. One owed five hundred denarii, and the other fifty. 42 And when they had nothing

with which to repay, he freely forgave them both. Tell Me, therefore, which of them will love him more?"

43 Simon answered and said, "I suppose the one whom he forgave more."

And He said to him, "You have rightly judged."

44 Then He turned to the woman and said to Simon, "Do you see this woman? I entered your house; you gave Me no water for My feet, but she has washed My feet with her tears and wiped them with the hair of her head. 45 You gave Me no kiss, but this woman has not ceased to kiss My feet since the time I came in. 46 You did not anoint My head with oil, but this woman has anointed My feet with fragrant oil.

47 Therefore I say to you, her sins, which are MANY, are forgiven, for she loved much. But to whom little is forgiven, the same loves little."

48 Then He said to her, "Your sins are forgiven."

The point is this: when we see what a wretched sinner we have been, or sometimes still are, and what an amazing God we have, to whom we can pour our hearts out, something indescribable happens inside us.

It's when we begin to truly grasp how much we've each **been forgiven, and what Yeshua went thru, for you and for me – that we begin to love him more than ever**. As **Luke 7:47** says, those who feel they've been forgiven just a little, also love just a little, and vice versa.

If you don't feel a profound love for your Master and future husband, it's because you either haven't come to see how much he's forgiven you, and what he had to go through TO forgive you – or you haven't accepted his forgiveness.

As we come closer to Passover, this is such a huge point. We must come to see ourselves and not keep looking at the splinter – or even log jam – in anyone else's eye. We have enough in our own eye.

SO **Point 1**—We can love God and Christ because God extended his love to us first, if we will accept it (1 John 4:19; John 3:16-17, 36).

*****Point 2** – we will love Christ equal to the degree we realize - and accept -- how much he's forgiven our huge debts of sin.***

Now the next point.

POINT 3: Love him more by doing the things that please him. Get in harmony with the way this Family of God lives – obediently to Father in heaven.

I covered this last time, so will just touch on it here. **Yeshua said he always did the things that pleased his father (John 8:29).** He sought the Father's will in his life (**John 5:30; 6:38**). He sought his father's guidance. He prayed all night – seeking his father in heaven – to help guide the selection of the 12 apostles. So the bond between Father in heaven and our Christ was an unbreakable bond of profound love.

Last time I spoke of building relationships is like deposits and withdrawals. Think of doing good works as being pleasing to God. Think of sin as being very displeasing.

And back to point 2 – because of the “deposit” of love that Christ did for us in his life and crucifixion, we love him immensely when we grasp it. Now it's our turn to return that love to Christ and our Father.

How? By doing his will, by pleasing him, by letting Christ live again in us in the very same way he lived before: obediently, submitted to him and to one another, and by serving and taking care of even “the least of these” his brethren.

We do not like upsetting someone we're falling in love with. And if that happens too often, what happens? The Engagement is terminated!

All relationships grow when they're not getting hit over and over again by things that one party finds painful, distasteful, awful, or disgusting! They grow when each side seeks to serve, please and be in harmony with the other. This applies to marriage, parent-child, boss – employee, or any relationship. In this case, Christ is our head and we follow him and submit to him. Is he really “Lord of your life”?

As a future wife of CHRIST, let's get into the Biblical wife roles – of loving him, in obedience to his will, and submitting to him and his goals. You know the scriptures in 1 Peter 3:1-7; Ephesians 5:22-24; Col. 3:18. We're all the “wife” here, whether we're a male or female.

Ephesians 5:22-24

“Wives, submit to your own husbands, as to the Lord. 23 For the husband is head of the wife, as also Christ is head of the church; and He is the Savior of the body. 24 Therefore, just as the

church is subject to Christ, so let the wives be to their own husbands in everything.”

Liberal feminism is destroying many marriages. And it think it's making even Christ's role as "husband" in our relationship, a weaker one. Where have all the men gone? Where have all the loving husbands and good fathers gone? And where are the wives who let their husbands be "head" of their relationship as **1 Corinthians 11:3** says, just as **Ephesians 5:23** says.

Is Christ really head of your life and your relationship with him?

So let's let Jesus lead. We seek it. We don't always like where He leads us and what he makes us go through, but in love and faith with him, we say, "Yes, Beloved. You lead, I'll follow." Sometimes it's only later that we understand why he led us where he did.

John 15:9-10

"As the Father loved Me, I also have loved you; abide in My love. 10 If you keep My commandments, you will abide in My love, just as I have kept My Father's commandments and abide in His love."

*I gave many more scriptures on this point last time, like 1 John 5; **1 John 2:3-6** and more. **Loving Christ HAS to include obeying him and our Father.** Seek to please Yeshua. I plan to give a sermon soon on the fact that we CAN, and MUST, please Him. Those in the flesh cannot please him, but **Romans 8:8-9** says but we are not in the flesh. Neither can we please him without faith – but when we do demonstrate faith, we can (**Heb. 11:5-6**).*

*Paul says to make it your aim to please him. (**1 Thess 4:1**). So to please him – do what Yeshua did: DO the things God the Father has told us to do. Love him, love one another and all humanity for that matter. Obey his way – it's even called "the WAY".*

Pt 4 now: FOLLOW your inner urges to EXPRESS your love to him. SPEAK to him, open up to him, pray often to him, walk and talk with him, SEEK HIM with all your heart.

Can you imagine if you never told your wife or husband that you love her or him? (**Story** in audio of this sermon of a couple I was counseling, and the man just couldn't say, "Yes, I love you" to his wife.) There are other ways to express your endearing affection besides saying so, but it's a good start.

*Speak to Yeshua in prayer. Some of you resist this. Why? Stephen prayed directly to Yeshua at the end of **Acts 7:57-60**, as he was being stoned. And John prayed directly to Yeshua – at the end of Revelation, “Come Lord”.*

Ladies, tell me: when you fell in love with the man you eventually married, did you just speak to that man’s father – or did you want to speak, even more so, to the one you were going to marry? That should settle the question right there of whether or not we should be talking also to Yeshua.

When you spoke to your fiancé, what terms did you use? You called him “Sweetheart, Darling, Honey” and so on, terms of endearment. Have you ever, in prayer, spoken TO Yeshua (Jesus) directly – and said, “my Beloved...” That’s used a lot in Song of songs (Song of Solomon).

She says, “I am my Beloved’s, and my Beloved is mine.”

King David says in one of his Psalms, “I will LOVE YOU, my Lord, my strength” (Psalm 18:1). The CJB says, “I love you, Adonai, my Strength.”

Psalm 116:1 – “I LOVE Yhvh....”

Do you ever speak that way TO him and about him?

Yeshua wants to be loved! Yeshua asked Peter 3x after the Resurrection – “Peter, DO YOU love me?” (**John 21:15-17**). Peter replies three times: “YES LORD, I love you!”

Have you ever spoken those same words that Peter used, that David used, to God, to Yeshua? Tonight, when you go to bed, kneel and look up adoringly and say, “Yeshua, my beloved, I LOVE YOU. Help me, please help me to love you more each day. And thank you for your love for me.”

Start talking that way with the King of kings. He’s going to marry you, we hope. Surely he wants to know you love him. Men, remember that collectively – all of us men and women being called to be the Bride, are all the BRIDE. We are all in the “female” role here, though we are – in the flesh – males. Don’t get quirky on me! Speak to your king as he is your king, your Loved one, your fiancé.

Paul says to men and women alike in Corinth, “....I have betrothed you to one husband, that I may present you as a chaste virgin to Christ.” (**2 Cor 11:2**).

When we were courting, we found all kinds of time to be together. Do that now with Yeshua, the Son of God. Make time for him.

Turn off the blankety-blank TV, turn off Snapchat, turn off Facebook and turn off other weapons of mass distraction that Satan has successfully used to take you away from REAL meaningful time, together, with real people and a real Savior waiting to hear your voice.

PT 5 – *We love him more – the more we LOVINGLY interact with his ENTIRE Body:* the people he has called, yes – even those you think are a little strange or are unlike you. I talked about this last time, but I want it in context this time of “falling in love” with Yeshua. We know John 13:34-35.

John 15:11-14

"These things I have spoken to you, that My joy may remain in you, and that your joy may be full. 12 This is My commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. 13 Greater love has no one than this, than to lay down one's life for his friends. 14 You are My friends if you do whatever I command you."

1 John 4:19-21

"We love because he first loved us. **20 If anyone says, "I love God," yet hates his brother, he is a liar. For anyone who does not love his brother, whom he has seen, cannot love God, whom he has not seen. 21 And he has given us this command: Whoever loves God MUST also love his brother.**"

HOW and WHY does this work?

Because the more we get to know, love, and pray for one another, the more we will see Christ working in the lives of others, and come to understand HIM more. We'll learn more about Christ even as we learn more about each other and how Christ is living in their lives.

All of us with His spirit, are part of the body of Christ. No part of the body of Christ therefore can be unholy. Either you're part of His holy body or not. If you are, you're holy. No part of Christ's body is unholy. He wants us to be ONE, as one as He and Father are one. That's the standard. See **John 17:20-20-23**.

And don't be involved with any gossip – to spread it or listen to it – that involves other children of God, people for whom God died!

You know one of the key signs Yeshua gave of being a true believer – that we love one another as he has loved us (**John 13:34-35**). That should not be limited to people who are part of just our corporate church group. ANYONE

who has God's spirit IS a part of the Body of Christ, period. We should love them and strive to be at one with them as much as possible.

- There have always been doctrinal differences. Much of the books of Romans, Galatians, Corinthians, etc. are devoted to clearing up doctrines. But mostly Paul says – accept non-salvational issues. Don't separate over those things. Let there be differences, and God's spirit will eventually guide us into all truth, or Christ will himself, when He returns.
- Paul decried the “I am of Paul, I am of Apollos” concept. Remember the head of my church, the head of your church, is not a man or woman. The head is Yeshua, Jesus the Christ (Col. 1:18).

pt 5 –**ASK HIM to show you how to love him more.** Then be prepared for how He answers. But we've shown you a start at least. Ask Him and he'll respond. Knock – and he'll open his door to you. Seek him, and he will let you find him.

Undoubtedly, there are other points that can and should be made, but the one main point I'm getting across: Be aware of the concept of actually “falling in love more with Jesus Christ, Yeshua the Messiah” more and more each week and each year of your life.

- We love Him because he first loved us. Father starts the process.
- You will love Christ deeply only after you realize how much he's forgiven you and what he went through to forgive you.
- Do the things PLEASING to Him. Obey him. Seek his will. Submit to his leadership in your life.
- EXPRESS your love and affection; SEEK him; SPEND TIME with Him.
- **LOVE the entire BODY of Christ.** We will grow in love with Christ the more we lovingly interact with His entire Body. We'll learn more about him and feel closer to Him.
